Response2Route and Newbridge Matters have submitted village green applications to protect three areas of land both from the proposed BRT and from future developments.

The applications have now been published and we need the public to send in letters of support.

The three applications are as follows:

'Land to the rear of 25-48 Rudmore Park and known as The Lane at Rudmore Park' (reference TVG10/2).

'Land to the rear of 77-123 Newbridge Road and known as The Track at Kaynton Mead' (reference TVG10/1).

'Land predominantly to the northeast of Newbridge Park and Ride and known as Newbridge Meadows in Newbridge, Bath'. (reference TVG10/3)

Letters of support will really help us to obtain Village Green status - particularly as we know the Council will object. You do not need to have used the proposed Village Green areas for recreation yourself, but can still write in to say you support the applications. The more letters of support sent in, the more likely the chances of preserving this green space for future generations.

If any one of these three applications is successful, it will be ILLEGAL to build or develop on the land in question, which will effectively stop the BRT route completely.
